

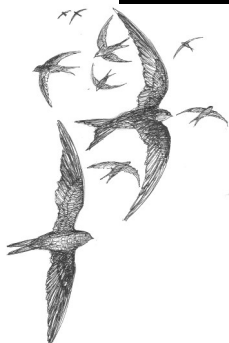

A Journey through the Bible with Tiglath

'Tiglath' is taking a break for the summer but will return in September

Paul's two letters to Timothy and his letter to Titus



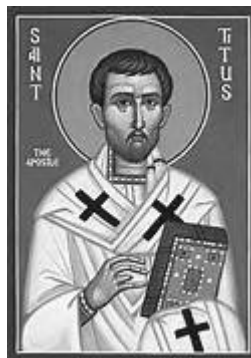
These letters are known as pastoral letters on account of their concern for church order and practical Christian living. Although the three letters have different settings and concerns they all embrace the underlying issue of the presence of false teaching and teachers at Ephesus: *1 Timothy 4:1-5*, *2 Timothy 3:1-9* and *Titus 1:10-16*

Timothy is first mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles (16:1). His father was a Greek pagan, but his mother was a devout Jew named Eunice (see *2 Tim. 1:5*). Since childhood he had been instructed in the Old Testament (*2 Tim. 3:15*) where Paul is charged to write verses. (*2 Tim. 3:16,17*)

'All scripture is God breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking correcting and training in righteousness so that a man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.'

Important words emphasising the inspiration and authority of scripture in Christian teaching, belief and practice.

Titus was a Greek, son of Gentile parents. After his conversion to Christianity Titus accompanied Paul to Jerusalem, where Paul rejected the demand by the Jewish converts that he should be circumcised and thus Titus became a person of significance for the principle of Gentile admission to the church, solely on the basis of faith in Christ. He was assigned by Paul during his third missionary journey to Corinth to try to solve its problems (*1 Cor. 1:6*) and to encourage material assistance to the needy of Jerusalem (*2 Cor. 8*). Much later Titus was in Crete, left behind by Paul to organise the churches there. Paul gave him the task to appoint/ordain elders (*Titus 1:5*) describing the requirements for such:



An elder must be blameless, the husband of one wife; a man whose children believe and are not open to the charge of being wild and disobedient.....being hospitable, self controlled, holy and disciplinedtrustworthy to the message to encourage others by sound doctrine and refute those who oppose it (Titus 1:6-9)

A teaching I would say not just for Church ministers, but for Christian parents in general.

Dear friends,

When I have written the "Vicar's Letter" for previous editions of the July and August parish magazines, I have written on topics such as Summer Holidays or Travel to exotic locations. As I sit to write this month's letter, I am finding it very hard to even think about such subjects as holidays. Still fresh in many of our minds is the unexpected death of Julie Gale last week. Yesterday my Grandfather died and MP Jo Cox was killed in West Yorkshire. All of this is on top of the mass-shooting in Orlando just 5 days ago, where the killer specifically targeted and killed over 50 members of the LGBTQI, (*Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer or Questioning, and Intersex*) community. It has been a week full of grief fear and hatred.

There is one universal emotion which is written across all of the above events - grief. Grief is a very complicated emotion and much has been written about it, as my bookshelves will bear witness to. How our own grief unfolds can depend upon the circumstances of a person's death. There is no right way to grieve, how each one of us deals with grief is as unique as our own finger prints. Sadly, as we journey through life, experience teaches us that grief is not just one emotion, but rather a succession of feelings which ebb and flow through us. For some these feelings may be fleeting; and for others last a lifetime.

Many of us in my family see my Grandfather's death as a blessed relief from his suffering and pain. Our grief is tempered by a sense of relief in knowing that he is with our father in heaven, where there is neither pain nor anguish. I am however, very conscious that others who lose a loved one through acts of violence and hatred, such as in Orlando or West Yorkshire, will not feel as we do. Families are left with a feeling of "why?" and surely at times a deep sense of anger, when the life of a loved one is cut so violently short. Their grief is amplified through the hatred which caused the death of their loved ones.

But what makes grief feel so unbearable? It is love which makes death such a painful event, as we grieve for those whom we love but can see no longer. It is also love which helps us to bear our grief. As after the death of a loved one, our love for them is no less then when they were alive and continues after their death. It is in this gap where we find Jesus standing, in tension between the love that causes our grief and the love of a lost one which sustains and cheers us. It is his love which helps us in our grief. It is also his love which will defeat the forces of hatred and fear. Brendan, husband of MP Jo Cox wrote in tribute to his wife, "She would have wanted two things above all else to happen now: one, that our precious children are bathed in love and two, that we all unite to fight against the hatred that killed her....Hate doesn't have a creed, race or religion,

it is poisonous.”

Here is the hope to which we may cling. Love is more powerful than hatred. Love is deeper than anger. Love is more penetrating and wiser than any forces for harm. Love wins. Jesus said “Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples.” Tears shed in grief are never done so in vain. If they are tears of loss and the love that that represents, they are also tears of hope for love’s ability to change everything.


It is by loving one another that we comfort those who grieve. It is only by loving one another that we can defeat the forces of hate.

Nature Notes by Bluebell - July and August 2016



Bluebell has noticed a lot of rabbits about recently. She rather liked seeing them and thought they were very sweet, but now they have eaten all her young runner bean plants she is not so sure. Passing close to one little rabbit, she watched it flatten and keep still in the short grass, till the dogs had gone by, when suddenly it leaped up and bolted for safety in the hedge. The swallows are nesting in the front porch again and fill the air with the sweet sound of their twittering calls, like water running over pebbles in a little narrow brook.



Swifts came back almost two weeks late. But they, too, have nested under the eaves again this year. Bluebell loves to watch and listen to them screaming round the house in the sun-bright blue sky on fine mornings and evenings. They seem like the real exhilaration of summer, miraculous travellers, their return is thrilling:

"They've made it again, Which means the globe's still working, the Creation's Still waking refreshed.." *Ted Hughes; Season Songs 1976, Summer; Swifts*

"One wing below mineral limit
One wing above dream and number
Shears between life and death "

The Swift comes the swift; Adam and the Sacred Nine ;Ted Hughes 1979

Swift numbers are falling, by 39% in the past decade. " these birds are specialists in joy: they bring the sun to the cold north and they bring the rains to the parched south." Africa. *Simon Barnes; RSPB Nature's Home, Autumn 2014*



Wall Pennywort (Navelwort) is one of the many wildflowers to be found growing in the tangled glory of our deep west-country lanes, often on stone walls, among Foxgloves, pink Campion, white Stitchwort, Bluebells, golden Buttercups, red Sorrel and glorious green shuttlecock and hart's tongue Ferns. "In the south-west every child has picked off the walls the fat, dimpled, shining penny leaves and played with them. It was the glabrous and pale (Tudor) silver penny they were compared to, not the coppers of our time." *The Englishman's Flora: Geoffrey Grigson. 1958*

Bluebell was sorry and sad to do it, but admits she has killed three young hornet queens this season, two in her wood-burner boiler room, after watching an epic battle between the hornet and two spiders, and one in the boot room. She just couldn't cope with a hornet's nest or three in the house environs... beautiful but scary.
