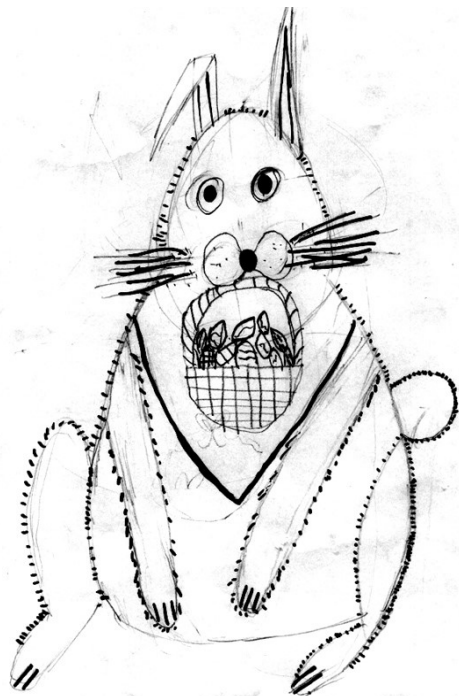

An introduction to the book of Revelation



Some 10 years ago, on a holiday in the Aegean Greek Island of Samos, Mary and I made a day trip by ferry to the island of Patmos. John, considered to be the author of the book of Revelation, was exiled to Patmos (see 1.9) Although a low lying, barren and rather treeless island we found it a spiritual place, especially the cave where traditionally it is accepted that John received his vision of Christ and an angel. It is also the site of a Christian Orthodox church. During Roman times the island was a penal colony with the prisoners working in the extensive quarries.

In the prologue to the book the writer names himself as John, (thought to be John the apostle, brother of James and son of Zebedee) to whom a vision came of *'one like a Son of man'* 1.13, and instructing him to *'write on a scroll what you see'* 1.11.

Hence John wrote the book of Revelation, the final book of the bible.

It is a difficult book to understand and comment on, so I have relied initially to a large extent on introductions in three different bibles viz: the Jerusalem Bible, the New International version and the Good News Bible and also the Lion Encyclopedia of the Bible.

The Jerusalem bible basically describes Revelation as a distinct apocalyptic literary form very popular in some Jewish circles at the beginning of the Christian era – 'apocalyptic' from the Greek meaning uncovering. The framework of a vision of hidden supernatural events in a language in which the vision is richly symbolic and rather allusive giving rise to different interpretations.

The N.I.V. introduces the book as messages to the seven churches in Asia Minor (modern-day Turkey), followed by visions of the end of history and the final judgement.

The Good News bible states the writer's main concern is to give readers hope and encouragement, urging them to remain faithful during times of suffering and persecution - particularly at the then time of increasing Roman official hostility. There is a central theme that through Christ, God will finally and totally defeat all his enemies, including Satan, and reward his faithful people with the blessing of new heaven and a new earth, when this victory is complete. See the final chapters 21 and 22.

The Lion Encyclopedia states that the book of Revelation is unique in the New Testament with its message of the final victory of Jesus over all the forces that oppose God, conveyed in a series of 7 groups of visions.

In the next Parish News I will attempt to comment selectively on the actual text of Revelation.

Christian Aid Week 14 - 20 May

Christian Aid is an agency of the churches in Britain and Ireland, with Archbishop Rowan Williams as chair of the Board of Trustees. It works globally for

profound change - so that all can live free from poverty. Christian Aid works with 700 local overseas organisations, distributing emergency aid as necessary; it also trains people to deal with the effects of climate change and prepares them for the threat of natural disasters - as well as working on HIV, training and education, health, sanitation and peace and reconciliation.

For the year 2015/16 its total income was £107 million, 8% more than last year and expenditure of £104 million of which 15% was spent on fund raising and only 1% on governance. Its main sources of income other than from institutional bodies etc. is fund raising during Christian Aid week amounting last year to £11.3 million, and from emergency appeals of £12 million.

This year Christian Aid Week is from 14 - 20 May. This is the 60th anniversary of Christian Aid week when in 1957 the then director Janet Lacey started the week to raise funds to encourage public awareness. She collected £26,000 for overseas development work.

Christian Aid envelopes will be available in all the benefice churches for donations. Please either pass them to me, send them direct to Christian Aid, Freepost, PO Box 100, London SE1 7RT, or take to the Tavistock Parish Church Centre, Plymouth Road Tavistock.

On Sunday 14th May Tavistock Area Christians Together (TACT) will be holding an evening service for Christian Aid. Venue to be advised.

To my Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

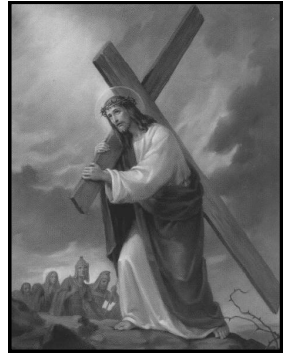

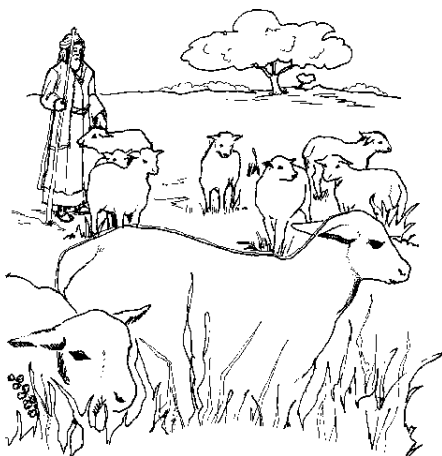
The Shepherd's Voice

How many of you have a dog? If you have a dog, you probably spend a lot of time with your dog. You play with your dog and perhaps you throw a ball or a stick for it to chase and bring back to you. You love your dog, feed it, and take care of it and you become very close. When you have to go to school, your dog can get pretty lonely being alone all day with no one to play with. If you are like most kids, when you get home from school, one of the first things you do is go out to the garden and call your dog. As soon as your dog hears your voice, it comes running.

What do you think would happen if a stranger opened your gate and called your dog? Do you think your dog would come running to a stranger? No way! It might even bark or growl at the stranger. A dog knows his master's voice and will only do what his master tells him to do.

The Bible tells us that Jesus said the same thing is true with sheep and their shepherd. He said that the shepherd will go ahead of the sheep and the sheep will follow him because they know his voice. Jesus goes on to say that sheep will never follow a stranger because they don't recognize his voice; in fact, Jesus says they will run from a stranger!

Jesus wants us to understand that he is the shepherd and we are his sheep. If Jesus is our master, we will know his voice and will do what he wants us to do. Sometimes, other people will try to get us to do something we should not do. If Jesus is our master, we won't listen to their voice. Sometimes, the devil tries to get us to do something that we should not do. If Jesus is our master, we won't listen to the devil's voice.



The shepherd always wants what is best for his sheep. He leads them into green pastures where they have plenty to eat. He leads them to water so that they have plenty to drink. He leads them to the shelter where they will be safe from the storm. Jesus wants what is best for us. He said that he came so that we could have life and have it abundantly. We will, if we listen to his voice and follow him.

Father, we thank you for Jesus, the Good Shepherd, who came that we might have life, and have it abundantly. Help us to listen to his voice and to follow him. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen

Nature Notes by Bluebell - April - May 2017



"Hope is the thing with feathers,
That perches in the soul,
And sings the tune without the words,
And never stops - at all."

Emily Dickinson

The first of the migrants to return, the little chiffchaff, "the feathered metronome", is back, and Bluebell has heard and seen it singing its simple two note song, on a high twig of a willow tree. It marks the very start of Spring amid the bitter winds of March.



But Hope and Faith, (the gifts of the Spirit, with Love, the greatest of these three, 1 Cor 13. 13.) will soon be rewarded with the wonderful mornings of Dawn Chorus and bud burst, as the birds return and sing and breed. Already they are in fine colour and breeding plumage, and Bluebell has found a blackbird's nest in the big pink camellia tree. The greater Spotted Woodpeckers have a new nest hole, and five jackdaws are gathering and dropping sticks and sheep's wool round the eyes. It will take them some time and much effort and mess to make their nests.

"...daffodils,
That come before the swallow dares, and take
The winds of March with beauty: violets dim,
But sweeter than the lids of Juno's eyes
Or Cytherea's breath; pale prime-roses,
That die unmarried, ere they can behold
Bright Phoebus in his strength, - "*The Winter's Tale, IV. iii.*
Shakespeare's incomparable lines summon up early Spring.



Daffodils, birdsong and lambs, shining, swaggering cock pheasants in bright feathers, the valley of the Tamar in spring! - The Tamar valley used to send thousands of bunches of daffodils to the markets in London but the daffodils were dug up from the fields and flung into the hedges by landgirls when the government ordered the flower fields of the Tamar Valley to be requisitioned to grow food during the last war. Many of the bulbs continued to flourish even in hedge-rows, to delight us today.

There are now many different species of daffodils, flowering early or late, and the Tamar Valley Double White, a sweet scented sport of the "Whitsun Lily" Pheasant's Eye was the pride of the valley.

GARDEN NOTES BY DOUG

Well, winter is fighting to stay, kicking up a fuss. I can never understand why it doesn't just give up and joyfully board one of those lovely cruise ships and sail down to the southern hemisphere. Once there it can antagonise autumn and run amok. Meanwhile, spring in the garden is like a baby. It wants attention.

It grows fast. You may think it's asleep and you can get on with other jobs? A bit of love now will avoid delinquency later. Strike when the sun's hot!

*'Plastics are made by fools like me
But only God can make a tree'*



Well, that's not the original because in 1913 there were no plastics. Now it seems – according to a report quoted on the BBC – an estimated five trillion plastic pieces weighing more than 250,000 tonnes are afloat at sea. We all need to do our bit to manage this. Gardeners are great consumers of plastics. Pots,

grow bags, compost bags, trays, fleece, polythene, etc. Much of it one-trip, single-use, non-recyclable. We gardeners need to do our bit. And don't be tempted to burn it. Plastics can only be burnt safely at high temperatures – incinerated – or very toxic stuff is released.

If you love your tomatoes, plant some basil seeds now. And, more than one sort, maybe. And, some chillies. Yum!

Got some pots or bare earth you're not sure what to do with? Don't fancy a trip to the garden centre to buy bedding plants (in plastic trays!). Why not plant some annual flower seeds? If you remember the last Olympics, you might recall the 'meadows' of wild flowers? If you can, look at

Pictorialmeadows.co.uk or, if you only want small quantities of seed, there are a lot of options – Chiltern Seeds, Unwins, Suttons, Thomson & Morgan – to name a few. Many do some version of 'meadow' or 'wild flower' seeds. Chuck 'em on the soil, zizz it up a bit, water, keep the slugs and snails off, forget it for a few weeks and then be amazed at the results.

Well, the original was by an American poet, Joyce Kilmer, written in February 1913 and much parodied ever since. Called "Trees" it goes:



*I think that I shall never see
A poem lovely as a tree.....etc
Poems are made by fools like me,
But only God can make a tree.*
