Dear Friends,

It was with much sadness that we said farewell to Fr Andy at the end of August, but it was good to send him on his way with the warmest of wishes for him and the family in their new home across the Tamar.

We have now started on this vacancy journey together, which we shall be navigating through the coming year.

I do earnestly ask you to pray for our Churchwardens and Chapel Wardens during this period, as the responsibility rests with them for the continuation of the good order of our churches.

Pray too for our new Rural Dean, Rev'd Andrew Thomas from

Yelverton, who will be assisting them while also settling into his new role.

Being in a vacancy means there may need to be some compromises over service times or formats, so please be gracious and compassionate in your responses to changes from the normal.

May I be so bold as to ask for your prayers for me and my family too.

While the legal responsibility for the parishes sits with the wardens, there will naturally be an expectation from many that the person in the collar will pick up the pieces, and I will indeed endeavour to do everything I can for you all in our mission community, but I also have training requirements to meet still which may mean I am stretched in two directions.

From 28th October to 23rd November, I have to minister in an alternative context as part of my training, so I will be out of contact with you during that period.

Please do reach out to the wardens in the first instance if you have any queries during this time.

As we look to the future, we will be starting on the process of advertising for a new minister for our mission community. The best advert is you, the people who make up our wonderful churches and communities.

Please do not let up in your efforts to do life together here, and to love and care for each other.

What you all do in our churches, in our schools, in our care homes and in our villages is what makes this place attractive. In the coming months, make every effort to support what is happening in our churches and communities. If you can seethat someone has too much on their plate, offer to help. Try volunteering for something new – you might find you like it!

Travel to a service in a church you haven't been to for a while. Do what you can to draw closer as a benefice, being united in our worship and our love for our neighbour.

Communion next Sunday, 22 nd September at Milton Abbot.



His crying out disturbed the people around him. "Be guiet!" they yelled at him. But he only shouted louder.


When Jesus heard Bartimaeus crying out, He stopped and said,



COULD THIS BE YOU?


At the recent meeting of the Benefice Pastoral Care Team on the 24th June, it was agreed that we should run a locally based Anna Friends Training Course in October. With Rev. Andy leaving and Rev. Phill holding the fort with support from Tim Thompson and Richard Searight, there was a recognition that many of our older folk, who can longer physically attend our church services, should be supported as much as possible by our local lay people. Anna Friends work alongside Anna Chaplains (Annie Jefferies and Josie Whitfield) to offer varying degrees of spiritual support. This might be personal visits to people's home, telephone support or taking worship services in care homes.

All six of our churches have parishioners in their later years and when falls or illness make people housebound, we should have a flexible team who can visit these people at home. It would therefore be ideal to have one or two people from each church who might consider doing the Anna Friends course which is done over three training sessions of two hours each.

The course will cover:-

- what it means to be a good and focused listener
- the ageing process, grief and loss
- what is dementia and how can we meaningfully engage with individuals and their families
- how to select helpful Bible readings
- writing simple prayers
- offering people Holy Communion at home

The course will run in October, dates to be agreed depending on what is convenient to those wishing to attend. For more details contact Annie (614178) or Josie (07989 666427).







FOUNDATIONS COURSE

What is the Foundations Course?

Foundations is the introductory course for everyone in the Diocese of Exeter who is exploring their vocation (both lay and ordained).

The course is designed to help people grow in their discipleship, and flourish as part of the Church. It is the foundational course to train as a Licensed Lay Minister (Reader), for ordination training or to train for one of the new Commissioned roles. It is run by the Diocese of Exeter as part of our commitment to lifelong learning and development for all, and is open to everyone who is a member of a church community.

How do I get onto the course?

To apply to do the course please fill in an application form. There is no interview to get on the course, it is open to everyone – whatever their level of education.

How does the course run?

The Foundations course is a mixture of in person and online teaching. There will be several intakes a year and it will run in different locations to make it as accessible as possible for a wide range of people across Devon. If you apply to do the course in 2024/5, you will be invited to join one of the three regional groups, in the following locations:

- Plymouth (St Jude's Church) running from October 2024 to March 2025
- Barnstaple (Holy Trinity) running from February to June 2025
- Exeter (The Old Deanery) running from February to June 2025

What is the time commitment?

Each course group will run for:

- 3 Saturdays (10am 4pm)
- 4 evenings (7pm 9pm)

GARDEN NOTES BY DOUG



Murder Slugs, snails and puppy dogs tails. I won't mention the weather! We Brits always grumble about the weather - whether the weather be good, or whether the weather be bad. It does seem to have been the most awkward gardening year I can

remember - and I do stretch back a few years. Some things have done very well (the fig and olive tree) and other things very poorly (the dahlias). Most of my dahlias, in pots or in the ground, were eaten as soon as they appeared above the soil. Normally, they would see some later, drier days and sprout up and run away towards the sunshine and blue sky. Well, some in pots did, but others didn't. I won't put pellets down because we have hedgehogs. We've seen them in the headlights in the drive in the dark. Don't think we've got a nest, but they

do roam far at night.



You may remember I sowed some annual meadow seeds again in spring into a patch of bare soil. The previous year it was disappointing. A lot didn't germinate. Well, this year it was somewhat better although not overwhelming. I think maybe it isn't quite as sunny a spot as the annual flowers would love. But, it's easy and it's colourful. You just need bare soil and a sunny spot.

You might need some flappy things on a string to dissuade the birds from taking the seed.

Life in the greenhouse

has not been too bad. The tomatoes have done very well although they were a bit slow initially. The cucumbers have outdone the courgettes.

Cucumber soup anyone?

You just have to accept what happens. You can try and adapt but won't always win. That's part of the joy of gardening. Every year is different when you're closely involved.



The thing to do now is to think about what you want from your garden next year?

Start clearing borders and pots, but leave some seed-heads for the birds. Hope the hedgehogs thrive.

I will have sunflowers and dahlias again! Perhaps we'll be blessed by a lovely autumn; warm and sunny. Enjoy!

NATURE NOTES BY BLUEBELL



"While barred clouds bloom the soft-dying day And touch the stubble-plains with rosy hue: ...The redbreast whistles from a garden-croft; And gathering swallows twitter in the skies."

from To Autumn; John Keats, September 19, 1819

While there have been noticeably fewer swallows this summer, fewer butterflies on the buddleia and Sedum flowers, moths have hardly banged on the kitchen windows to get in at night nor blundered into the bedroom. But the bats seem fine, and the slugs! This has been a summer of slugs! At night with a torch, on the lawn there seems to be a slug every six inches. It is hard not to step on them, advancing slowly but determinedly.

Grey slugs, black ones, slugs of various shades of brown, and speckled.

The speckled one is a leopard slug which eats other slugs and so is to be cherished.

Slugs help to keep the land clean, eating decaying vegetation and carrion.

Slugs secrete two sorts of mucus, one is thin and watery.

A thicker mucus spreads out under the foot from front to back to protect the gastropod (bellyfoot).

Mucus also coats the whole body of the animal, tastes unpleasant, keeps its body moist, and makes it slippery and hard to grasp by predators.

Frogs, toads, snakes and especially hedgehogs eat slugs. Slugs can infect dogs and foxes with lung worm if eaten. Humans can eat them but slugs need to be starved for a week or more to clean out their intestines, and very thor-

oughly boiled, like snails.

They do not taste of much except butter and garlic. And they can carry some nasty infections and parasites if not thoroughly prepared.

Slugs are hermaphrodite, being both male and female in the same body. Bluebell has watched their courtship on damp nights. She has seen them curl up together in a circle, nose to tail, brown and grey, an orange frill visible round their feet. In the centre of the slugs they seemed to hug a milky-blue-

white globe, iridescent and glistening in the moonlight. Gradually this reduced in



size to a creamy cord joining the two animals. They both seem not at all bothered by many little tiny pale creatures, mites, scurrying all over them and in and out of the open pneumostome or breathing hole each slug bears on the right side near its head. The two slugs slowly uncurled and lay side by side together. It was easy to imagine affectionately. Then slowly, elegantly they glided apart. One was left with the now much smaller cream

coloured tube which silently disappeared, retracted under its mantle. The wonders of nature! In a few weeks there will be eggs!






